Conditions	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Open to all seven and six day financial Members. 2. The maximum Australian handicap is 36 for Men and 45 for Women. 3. Tees of the day: However, both Teams can decide to use other tees by agreement. 4. Start on 1st hole or 10th hole. If the 10th tee is used then the Matchplay Index is reversed (ie hole 10 becomes index 18 and so on). 5. Separate Men's and Women's competition. 6. The 4BBB Stroke Matchplay Championships (using the Matchplay Index) are knockout competitions. A draw will be conducted with matches to be completed by the designated dates, which will be on the schedule. 7. Each player's GA Handicap at the time of playing the 1st round will remain until the event is completed. The competition handicap is determined by the slope rating of the tees used. 8. Designated morning and afternoon tee-times will be made available on Saturdays and Sundays. You must phone the Pro Shop to book your 4BBB Matchplay round. If the slots are not booked 2 days prior to play, they will be opened up to members 9. All competitors shall have equal responsibility to initiate match arrangements well in advance of the designated completion date. Matches may take place, by agreement, outside of designated competition times. No matches may be played after the designated completion date, except on approval by Captain or Captain's delegate. <p>Competitors are expected to be flexible when arranging to play their match and consider extenuating circumstances. That is, players who have, for example child minding or work in either the morning or the afternoon (but not both), will take precedence over players who will only agree to play "at their usual time".</p> <p>Where an arrangement cannot be made, the Captain or the Captain's delegate, will determine which pair will progress to the next round, based on information provided by both teams. If both Pairs are inflexible, neither may proceed to the next round. Captain's decision is final.</p> <p>In special circumstances, the Captain may grant an extension of one week for the semi-finals. In the case of the final an extension may be granted to a date determined by the Captain.</p>

Rules of the Event	<p>4BBB Stroke Matchplay</p> <p>In Matchplay, the game is played hole by hole using the Matchplay Index. In Handicap Matchplay, a hole is won by the player/side that has the lower Nett score. The match score is kept by the term “holes up”, “holes down” or “all square” after the number of holes has been completed. A hole is halved if each player/side holes out with the same Nett score.</p> <p>A player/side may concede a hole or a match at any time before to the conclusion of the hole or the match. Concession of a stroke, hole or match may not be declined or withdrawn. A player/side is “dormie” when as many holes are up (or down) as there are holes left to play.</p> <p>A match is won by the player/side when the number of holes “up” is greater than the holes remaining to be played, i.e. 4 holes up with 3 holes to play are recorded as player/side A defeated player/side B “4 and 3” (4/3).</p> <p>Notes for Handicap Matchplay:</p> <p>(a) A match that ends “all square” shall be continued hole by hole from the 1st hole (or 10th hole if this was the starting hole), until one side wins a hole. Strokes are allowed as if the match has been recommenced, using the Matchplay Index on the scorecard.</p> <p>(b) The method of ascertaining each player's Handicap is that the lowest marker, in any particular match, goes back to scratch and then the other player or players are given the difference in their respective handicaps, with the strokes allocated using the Matchplay Index on the scorecard.</p> <p>(c) It is the responsibility of the winning team to post the match result on the Club Noticeboard. Failure to do so will result in disqualification with the losing team then proceeding to the next round.</p>
